During the 12 years I was a Home Hospice Volunteer, I learned that Geriatrics have a special place in my heart.

Writing and singing continue to be my enjoyment. I am still giving voice lessons and singing with a Sweet Adeline quartet. Creating and selling jewelry has proved to be a nice supplement to income. Included in my schedule is caring for my 92 year old mother and recently, upon nudging from the Lord, I joined a gym in order to finally work on becoming healthier and free of pain.
